Pilot region - characteristics

History "Cultural heritage Eisenwurzen"



"High rocks and walls of limestone and dolomit together with forested hills of soft stones"

Wet, cold atlantic climate

• Landuse: >80 % forest, spruce-fir-beech-forest
Highly structured cultivated landscape

Protected areas: > 200.000 ha


NEXT steps:

- Selection of potential partners and co-operations CONSULTATION & CO-DETERMINATION






Stakeholder-Interviews - SECTORS (n = 169)


SUCCESS: WHAT - WHY

- © Regional information events in smaller groups -shorter duration
- Interviews and talks with stakeholders to get their personal opinion and knowledge
- © Co-operation with existing structures/groups, e.g. office for regional development
- High interest to participate within ECONNECT

PROBLEMS: WHAT - WHY

- © Criticism: no clear target message within ECONNECT
- © Criticism: participatory approach too late
- People are sick of projects/working groups/meetings need of practical approach, implementation
- © General problems/refusal of "nature conservation" (Natura 2000, etc.)
- Existing prejudices/experiences on projects in Austria: e.g. Brown bear hunters WWF





Four working groups

- "Rivers" rivers lowland forests gravel banks tamarisk brown trout bullhead grayling otter ...
- "Natural Forests" forestry cells of natural forest big predators capercaillie woodpeckers Red deear ...
- "Alpine pastures extensively used grasslands" alpine pastures black grouse butterflies orchids ...
- "Communication" exchange of experience and expert knowledge public relations regional development tourism
